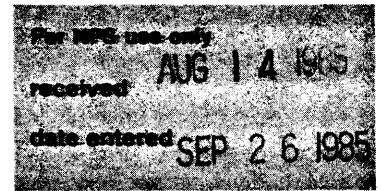

#1658 2501 Taos Alley (NW corner San Miguel & alley between N.M. & Montezuma), ill. 65.

4. Owner: Ignacita Maes, 2501 New Mexico, Las Vegas, N.M.
7. Description: T-shaped plan; stucco and concreted copings over foundation; stuccoed adobe walls; metal terneplate roof; small overhangs with frieze boards; 2/2 double-hung and wood casement (?) windows with wood surrounds; two single doors open to porch; lathe-turned porch columns. Located in a residential area, a block northwest from the edge of the hill where #'s 1639, 1641 stand.
8. Significance: Like the other two houses (two previous sheets) on this hill north of the heart of Old Town, and all other houses which stood at the fringes of the historic town, early information on this house is sketchy. The chronology of materials, styles and house plans developed with better dated houses provides a context, however, to understand this house. It was built in two or three portions. The long single file of rooms (to the left in ill. 65) may date to the 1870, when it would have been flat-roofed and had few openings. Or it may have been built at the same time as the one to the right about 1885. The windows, porch with its lathe-turned posts, and pitched roof were all added at that time. Two shed roofed portions were added to the rear later.
