Inventory of Historic Places in South Carolina

Description: Constructed in 1890, this Victorian cottage is a one story weatherboarded dwelling under a gabled roof with a front bay division of A/A/B/A/A. A gabled projecting central porch is supported by four regularly spaced slender posts of wood which are repeated in porch pilasters and corner boards. A rail balustrade ornaments the porch, which opens to a central doorway enframed with multi-paned transom and sidelights. Both front and end gables display cornice returns and centered, diamond shaped windows. Corbeled chimneys straddle the composition roof ridge. All windows are six-over-six under triangular caps with moveable blinds. The house is set on a lattice brick foundation.

Significance: This late Victorian cottage is a well preserved example of an earlier vernacular house style prevalent in Lexington County in the mid-nineteenth century, but of which few have survived from the antebellum period. The house was built by Misses Alice and Marcella Jones, sisters.
