18. Description Five bay, two-story brick (common bond) house. Low hip roof. Paired, interior brick end chimneys. Front entrance has three-light transom flanked by pilasters, plain entablature--6/6 pane window with sidelights (above door). Windows have 6/6 pane sash with jack arches and stone sills. A bracketed cornice extends around the house. One-story brick wing (SEE NEXT PAGE)			
19. History Abraham L. Williams sold the farm on which he was residing in 1855 (JF-492). It was probably at this time that he built this house on land he had earlier purchased with his brothers. He is shown as living at this location on the 1858 Bergmann Map of the county. The property, described on deeds as the Abraham Williams home- stead, stayed in the Williams family until 1919.			
20. Significance The Abraham L. Williams House is significant architecturally as a good example of a vernacular farm house in a transitional style which includes Greek Revival and Italianate motifs. Notable features are the low hip roof, paired interior end (SEE NEXT PAGE)
