Description

Whitehall is a one-story, brick, U-shaped, Georgian Revival residence. Each of the three sections has a gabled roof. The two projecting wings are pedimented and have a boxed cornice with block modillions, round vents and Doric pilasters at the corners. The central section features a pedimented Doric portico sheltering a central entrance with a semicircular fanlight and sidelights. A Doric entablature extends across the central section. Fenestration is regular six-over-six with dentiled architraves.

Significance

Whitehall was constructed ca. 1928 for Col. Robert McCormick, one of the owners of the Chicago Tribune. The house was designed by Willis Irvin of Augusta, who won a Gold Medal for Domestic Work at the 1929 Southern Architectural Exposition with its design. It is believed that some of the ornate interior woodwork came from the home of John C. Calhoun's daughter. Whitehall gets its name from the old Whitehall estate on the ruins of which this house was constructed.
