#### **Description**

The Grace Lutheran Church was constructed in 1928. Its architect is unknown. The building is constructed in the Gothic Revival architectural style and represents the European Traditional property type. It retains integrity of design, materials, workmanship, and feeling. The Grace Lutheran Church has been in continuous use as a church from 1928 to the present day.

The Grace Lutheran Church is located on the southwest corner of Moreland and 3rd Streets and faces east onto 3rd Street. The site is characterized by grass and asphalt surfaces, mature trees and palm lined sidewalks. The site also contains two non-contributing classroom buildings including a flat-roofed, one-story building to the west and a gable roofed building to the south.

The Grace Lutheran Church is a rectangular shaped, two-story building of stone construction. The building is divided into vertical bays by buttressed pilasters. It measures 80 x 100 feet. The gable roof with cross gable transept is covered with asphalt shingles. It has a concrete foundation. The walls are sheathed with scored plaster.

Exterior features include twin towers at the facade, detailed with crenulated parapets and framing a gable parapet wall. Pointed arched windows are located symmetrically along the walls. The entrance is raised, framed in its own gabled and buttressed wall plane, and features a pointed arched opening with a pair of rusticated wood doors. Important decorative elements include crenulated parapets, a dominant rose window, buttressed pilaster, stained glass and lancet windows at the rear, and scored plaster simulating stone ashlar construction.

The two semi-attached, post historic classroom buildings do not detract from the building's overall integrity.

### Statement of Significance

The Grace Lutheran Church is significant under Criteria C in the area of Significance of Architecture. Built in 1928, the Grace Lutheran Church is an excellent local example of the Gothic Revival architectural style and therefore represents the historic context "Religious Architecture in Phoenix, 1910-1942." While its architect is unknown, the Grace Lutheran Church is a good illustration of the European Traditional property type. The building possesses the important characteristics of the property type, specifically the embodiment of a stylistic idea based on the great cathedrals of Europe.

The most dramatic example of the Gothic Revival architectural style in a religious building in Phoenix is the Grace Lutheran Church. The complex massing of the facade within the overall symmetry of the building, produces a design that is truly reminiscent of the European Gothic religious architecture. Stylistic elements include traditional pointed arched openings, including those of the main entrance, the primary windows, and all belltower openings. Crenulated parapets and high pitched cross gabled roofs are also Gothic Revival design elements. Further stylistic imagery is seen in the scored plaster walls simulating stone construction, dominant rose window, buttressed pilasters, stained glass and lancet windows at the rear. The Grace Lutheran Church exemplifies one of the most widely used architectural styles for religious architecture in the United States, and is representative of the European Traditional property type.
