## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Calder houses in Cedar Rapids were built in 1868,

They are set along a main residential street of the city, surrounded mostly be clapboard dwellings dating from the turn of the century.

The houses share many features. Each is 24' x 36', two stories, with gable roofs and narrow, plain cornices. The light red brick was manufactured on the site, and laid in stretcher bond; that of 1216 was once painted white. The basic plan was a small rectangle, to which was attached a one-story, gable-roofed brick kitchen wing (about 12' x 11') at the right rear. Later (date unknown) the porch to the left of the wing was enclosed, forming a frame, shed-roofed kitchen (the earlier kitchen became the diningroom).

Windows, with original shutters, and entrances are segmentally arched, their placement in each house similar, except for the pairing, under one arch, of the second floor front windows in 1216. Entrance treatment differs: 1214 has a small wood porch with a flat arch, 1216 a vestibule of brick.

The interior layout is simple: Walnut staircase and main hall are to the right, opposite the entrance. The front room is living area, with kitchen and diningroom at the rear. Bedrooms and bath are upstairs. Rooms are plastered and papered, floors in 1214 are pine.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This pair of unpretentious brick houses is among the few remaining examples of mid-19th century housing stock in Cedar Rapids. Their vernacular design is strictly functional, in contrast to the variety of architectural influences which characterize much of the later house-building in the city.

Charles E. Calder (1840-1890) was born in central New York state, and came with his family to Cedar Rapids in 1851. The bulk of his fortune appears to have accrued through land speculation, for at his death he was termed "among the heaviest property holders" of the city.
