HOWITT HOUSE (407 N. Grand Avenue)

ARCHITECTURAL STATEMENT:

Description: The Howitt house is among the finest of the Victorian Gothic style buildings in Waukesha. The walls, constructed of cream city brick, rise two stories (with an attic) above a cut limestone foundation. The asymmetrically composed building is crowned by a truncated hip roof from which front and cross gables project. The roof is steeply pitched and covered with wood shingles. A pair of brick chimneys pierce the center of the hip roof. Gable peaks are graced with perforated details resembling decorative trusswork. A similar ornament accents a gablet which adjoins the front gable. Windows appear in pairs on the front gable and, like the remainder of the single windows, are narrow 1/1 sash capped by brick stilted arches with stone keystones. A two story bay window occupies the south gable and is detailed in a similar manner. The building was converted to commercial use in 1973 and the interior was remodeled with offices on the first floor, an apartment on the second. A frame addition has replaced a porch on the north elevation, and the front porch is a twentieth century replacement, however, these modifications do not seriously detract from the design.

Significance: Architecturally significant as a representative example of a period of construction, the Howitt house is one of the best examples of the Victorian Gothic style remaining in Waukesha. The building material, cream city brick, is also a notable feature as is the retention of the original roofing material. Other comparable examples of the style remain at 234 Carroll Street (Wk 39/32), 501 Barney Street (Wk 38/17), 712 N. East Avenue (Wk 2/15).

The property located at 407 North Grand Avenue, Waukesha, Waukesha County, Wisconsin is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. This property was listed in October of 1983 under the name: John Howitt House (NRIS# 83004341). New information based on archival research has determined that this house was never associated with John Howitt, but that the house was constructed in 1879 and owned by Michael Kelliher, a clothing merchant in Waukesha. Therefore the enclosed information is being submitted to correct the record.

The Michael Kelliher house is locally significant under Criterion C in the area of Architecture as one of the best examples of the Victorian Gothic style in Waukesha. The house is asymmetrical, constructed of cream city brick, is two stories plus an attic and has a cut limestone foundation. The house has a truncated hip roof and steeply pitched cross gables.

The front of the house is two bays wide, one of which projects from the wall plane and has a prominent front gable. The projecting bay has a pair of windows on the first floor and a pair of windows stacked directly above on the second floor; a single small rectangular window is centered under the gable. The recessed bay has the entrance under a hipped porch and a single tall window above. A small steeply pitched gable accents this single window. At the side of the house there is a three-sided projecting bay. This bay extends from the foundation to the second floor and has a hipped roof.

The cream city brick walls are accented with limestone trim. The arched windows are tall, narrow, one-over-one light with limestone sills, have projecting arched window hoods and elaborate keystone at the top of each arch. The gables are ornamented with intricate wood bargeboards.

- City Directories from 1895-1919 show John Howitt living at 219 Grand which becomes 411 N. Grand. Then, after 1917 he lives at 411 N. Grand.
- City directories show various tenants at 217 Grand (which becomes 407 N. Grand) until 1909 when Annie Angevine and Laverne Boyd reside there. The 1919 directory shows Laverne Boyd and Annie Angevine at 407 N. Grand. Laverne marries Killian Weber in the 1920's and continues to live there until her death in the 1960's. (Annie Angevine is Laverne's Mother. She dies in the 1920's)
- Therefore, 407 N. Grand was never owned by John Howitt. It was built in 1879 or 1880 by Michael Kelliher.
