This is a two-story over basement building; it has a heavy, solid look. The facade features end pavilions with hip roof sections and pedimented dormers. In the center, a Richardsonian Romanesque arch marks the entrance. On the second story above this entry are six smaller arches that formed an arcade. A square clock tower rises from the center and supports a lanterned dome.

Today the building has been painted gray, the ballustrade has been removed from around the bell tower (directly under the dome) and the entrance doors have been replaced by glass and steel. The arcade on the second floor is now enclosed for additional office space. The courtroom has a divided coved ceiling with Ionic pilasters and a balcony with extremely steep and narrow steps leading up to it. The litigation area is elevated making it easy for the spectators to see.

Originally, in what is designated as attic, 2 rooms were reserved for jurors, who could not easily "go and come", to stay overnight.

SIGNIFICANCE:

R. H. Hunt, the architect of the courthouse and a native of Elbert County, had moved away from Georgia in 1866. It was a mark of his success that he was commissioned to design the new courthouse.

The courthouse dominates the town of Elberton; as a center of local government it serves as a repository for official records and as headquarters for a sizeable geographical area.
