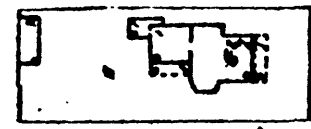

DESCRIPTION

FORM 2 story, L-plan, front gable house w/3-bay front, 1 story rear wing CONST. DATE c.1874
MATERIALS Brick, stone ARCH STYLE Vernac. Greek Revival
FENESTRATION Segmental arch predominates; 2/2 d.h.s.
DIST. FEATURES Porch, main entrance, window heads (see below)
ALTERATIONS Porch floor replaced with concrete at lower level than original
SITE & RELATED STR. Elevated lot, concrete retaining wall.

STATEMENT

This example of an important local house type displays a number of noteworthy decorative elements illustrating one of the many ways this type was expressed in Davenport. Flush keystone window heads drop to small molded corner blocks. Molded panels enrich porch frieze and main entrance soffit and reveals. The traditional gable-end oculus appears on the side gable, rather than at the front, which instead features a pair of round-arched windows.

This house was probably built in 1874 for Robert Henne and his wife Henrietta. Henne operated a cigar stand at the post office. Mrs. Henne continued at this location after her husband's death in 1885.
