STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: The architectural significance of the Crane-MasonHouse is its representation of a post-Civil War log house which developed into a double pen house type. Its walls of split logs joined with ½-dovetailed notches are characteristic or folk houses of this period. Other stylistic features include the foundation of pine blocks, the extended eaves on the side (east) wall to shelter stick- and-mud chimney (no longer extant), and the interior's floored attic used as a sleeping loft.
