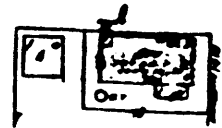

FORM 2 story, hipped tile roof, rectangular plan w/projecting side bay CONST. DATE c.1910
MATERIALS brick w/stone & concrete trim ARCH STYLE Renaissance Revival
FENESTRATION Rect. frt. windows have modified Gibbs surrounds, small curved roof dormer
DIST. FEATURES Engine entrance w/dogear concrete surround, quoining on side bay above ent.

ARCHITECTURE

STATEMENT

This station is similar to Hose Station #6 (11-E2301), but lacks the latter's arched engine entrance. It is an intact representation of the city's early 20th century fire protection program and a good example of small firehouse design.

IMPORTANCE

This building is one of a handful of neighborhood fire stations remaining in Davenport. Because of the continued presence of Central Fire Station and Hose Station No. 1, the importance of this building is severely diminished.

DESCRIPTION

Hose Station No. 6 was built in C. 1910 to service a central Davenport neighborhood. Its erection was part of an era of building construction after the turn of the century to better serve outlying neighborhoods.
