The stone is located in the front yard of 919 Eastern Avenue. It is located approximately 25 feet northeast of the Eastern Avenue curb and 370 feet northwest of 56th Avenue (Maryland). The fence surrounds the stone.

The boundary stone and fence have historically been situated at this location and maintain historic integrity.
