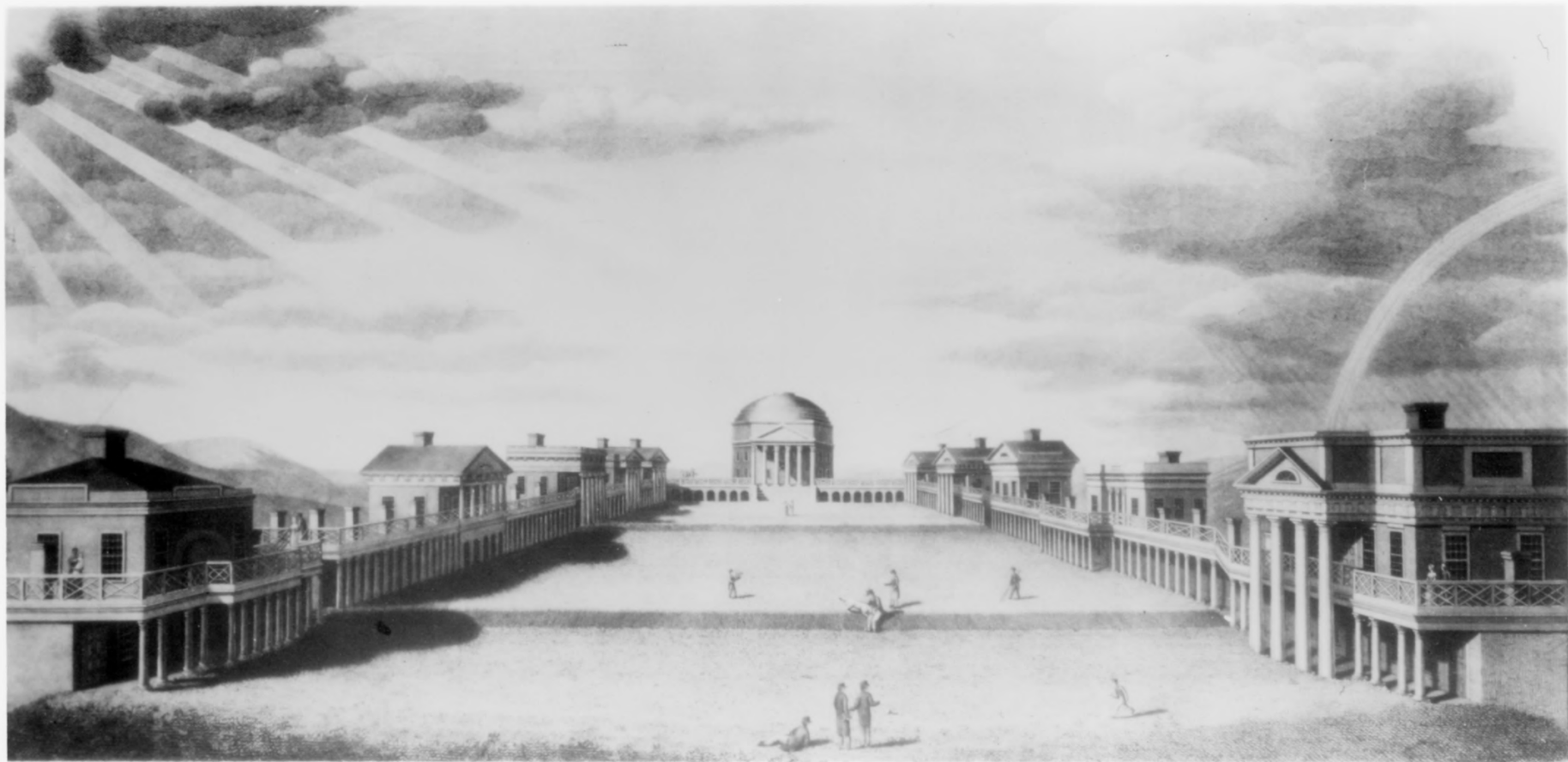


UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

The University of Virginia was designed and built by Thomas Jefferson. The "Academical Village" as Jefferson called it, surrounding the Lawn with the Rotunda at the North end, still serves as the focal point of the University. Thousands of visitors from all over the world come to the University each year to tour the Grounds, the carefully laid out gardens enclosed by the famous serpentine walls and to see the buildings Jefferson designed reflecting Roman and French classicism.

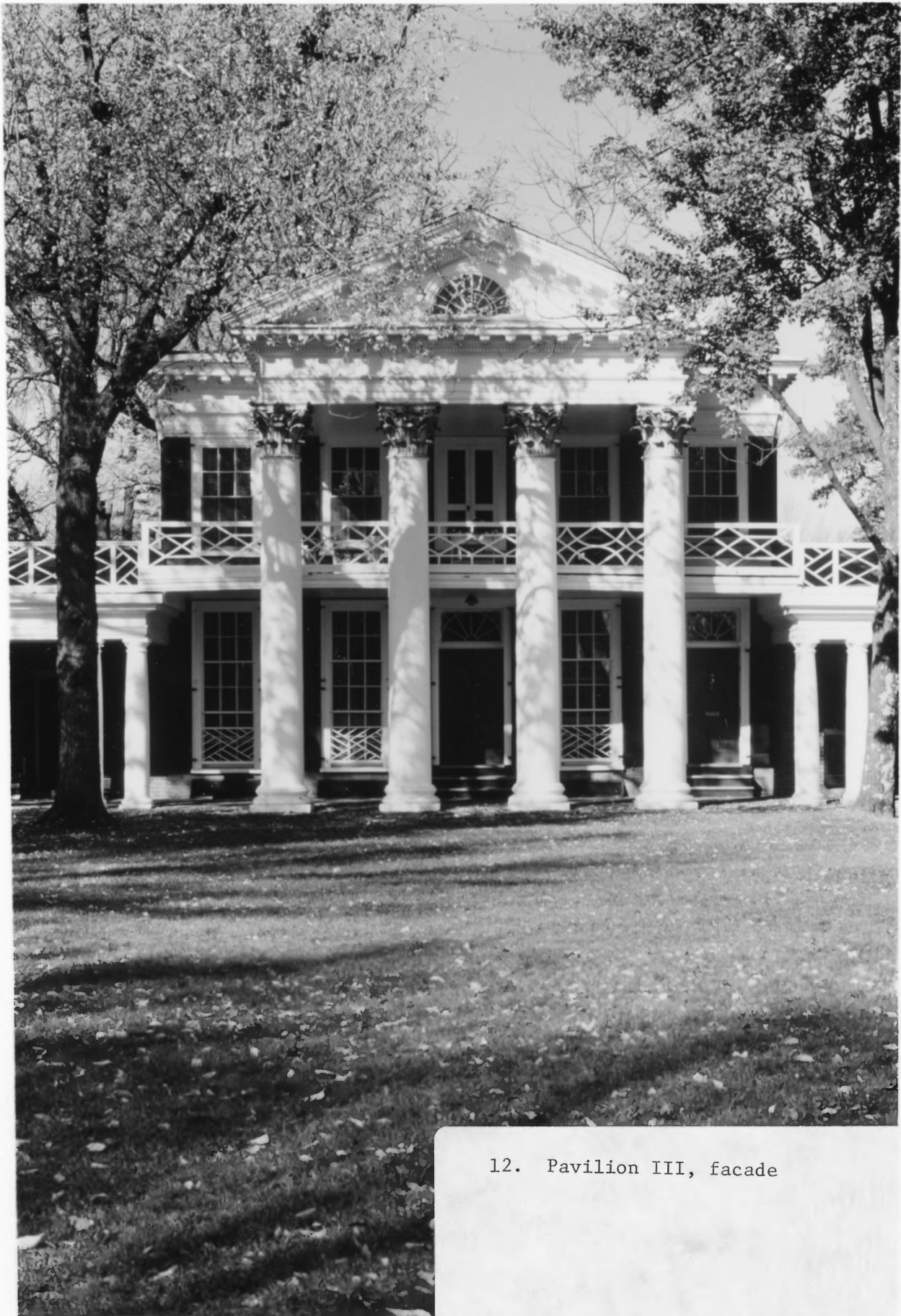

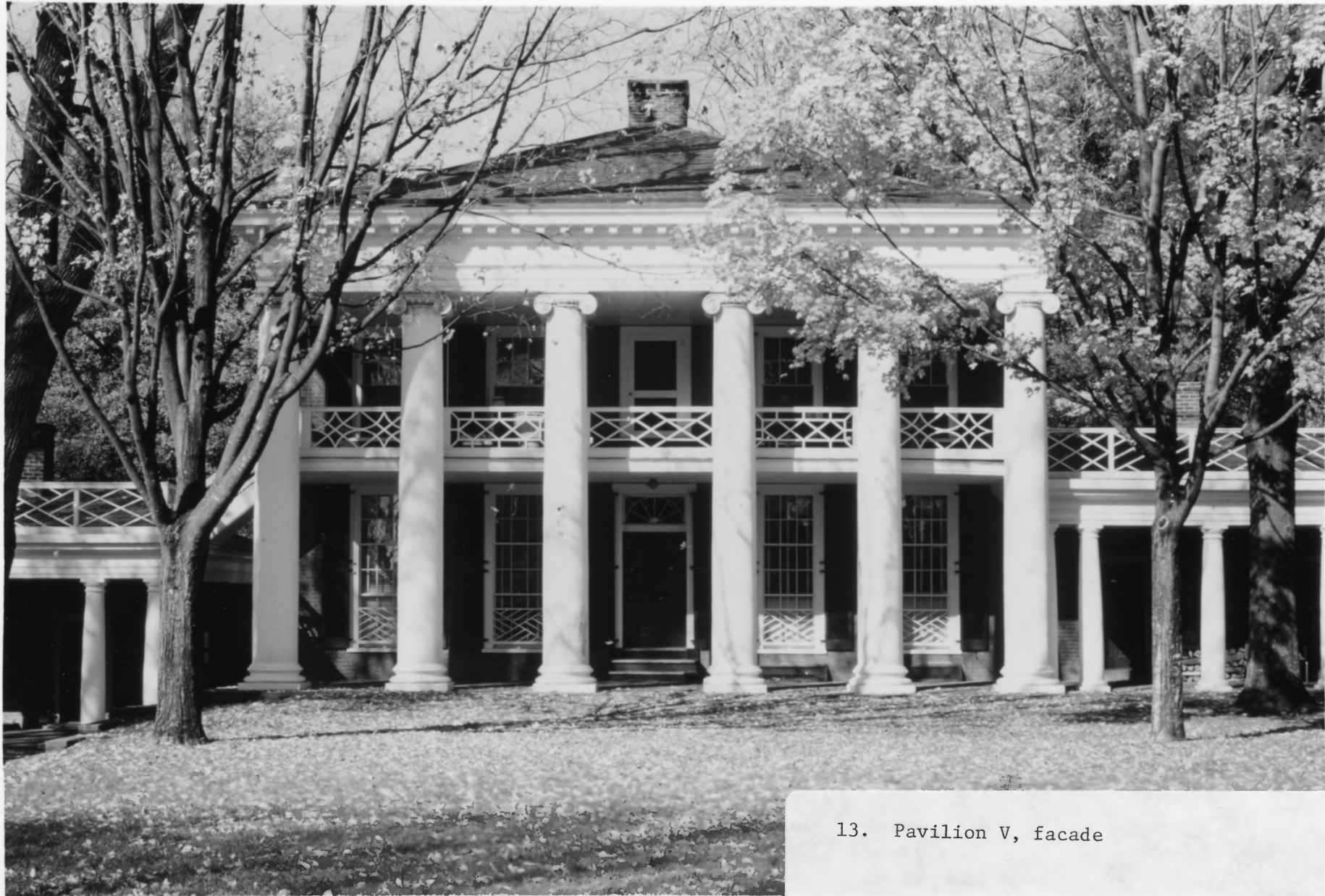
