SIGNIFICANCE	The house is significant architecturally as an example of vernacular architecture from the colonial era. The house is significant historically because it was the home of Urbana Woodruff, a son of Isaac Woodruff, one of Southington's early settlers. The house was also the home for many years of John Jamieson, Southington ice man for much of the first quarter of the 20th century. In 1918, Jamie married Minnie Moore of 469 Andrews Street(survey form #001) and moved to her home. Jamieson harvested ice from Sloper's Pond. The present owners purchased this 16-acre property in 1951.
