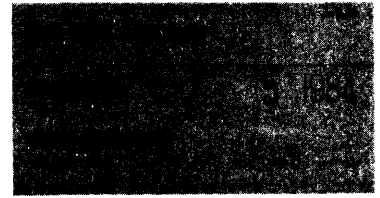

Description: The Waddle-Prather house is a two-story Colonial Revival home constructed ca. 1900. It has a one-story porch across the main facade with Tuscan columns resting on limestone piers. The porch also features dentils beneath the eaves and a balustrade. The doorway features sidelights and a transom with ornate leaded glass. Windows are one-over-one sash. The gable roof displays the original covering of pressed metal shingles. Also present on the roof are two gable dormers each of which contains a Palladian window with keystones and fan molding. The interior has been retained and displays its original woodwork.

Significance: The Waddle-Prather House was constructed ca. 1910 and is one of the best examples of the Colonial Revival style in the county. It features traditional revival features in the Tuscan porch columns, dentils and balustrade. The main entrance displays ornate leaded glass on the sidelights and transom and in the gable dormers are Palladian windows. Original interior features in the home have also been retained. The house has not been altered and is one of Somerset's best examples of the Neo-Classic movement.
