Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Depository, completed in 1936, is a two story building with exterior dimensions measuring 105 by 121 feet. Its height is 42 feet above the first floor level. The outer wall of the Depository is of light gray granite, lined with concrete, with polished black marble base trim. Included in the materials used in construction were 16,000 cubic feet of granite, 4200 cubic yards of concrete, 750 tons of reinforcing steel and 670 tons of structural steel.

At each corner of the structure, on the outside, are machine gun turrets. Sentry boxes, similar in design to the turrets at the corners of the Depository, are located at the entrance gate. A driveway encircles the building and a fence marks the boundaries of the site. The entrance is marble with a gold leaf inscription. The interior description and appearance are classified which prohibits disclosure.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Act of August 13, 1935, Public Law 267, authorized and directed the Secretary of War to transfer to the jurisdiction and control of the Secretary of the Treasury such portions of property within the Fort Knox Military Reservation suitable for the use of the Treasury Department as a depository. With this mandate, the Depository was constructed in 1936 at a cost of \$560,000. It was placed under the supervision of the Director of the Mint.

The Depository has always functioned as a storage site for the majority of U.S. gold stocks and other valuables. The first gold was moved to the Depository by railroad in 1937. Presently, the Depository stores 147 million fine ounces of gold, the largest concentration of U.S. gold in one location.

"Fort Knox" is a well-known landmark that is referred to frequently in factual and fictitious contexts. It has stood over the years as a symbol of the strength and power of the United States.

Due to the exceptional significance of the Fort Knox Bullion Depository in our nation's economic history, the period of significance has been extended to within the past fifty years.
