Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The 50' by 120' Hamm's Beer Depot consists of three sections: two-story east and west sections flank a central, one-story section. The symmetrically designed structure is on a corner site. Street facades are faced in red brick. The remainder is built of less expensive and unadorned yellow brick. The warehouse faces DeMers Avenue and backs up to a spur track of the former Northern Pacific Railroad.

A flat, parapeted roof is broken by a pediment projection centered in the one-story section. A simple metal cornice surmounts a decorated frieze of raised brick panels. A chimney stack projects above the two-story roof of the west section.

Raised brickwork is used for belt-coursing at the first and second floor levels and for decorative panels on the west side facade. The Hamm's logo, an eagle in a circle decorated with barley and hops, is carved in red sandstone and appears in the central pediment gable and at the southwest corner of the ware= house facing Fourth Street. The latter logo retains vestiges of its original polychrome paint; the former is deteriorated and is missing its carved keystone.

Two of the original rectangular windows are bricked over. The remainder are filled with glass blocks. An awning once covered the two central windows on the west side first floor. Several single entries and loading doors are seen in the warehouse. At some date after 1926, a single-bay garage was added to the building's east side. In 1977 the interior was remodeled, but warehouse and office functions were retained.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Hamm's Beer Depot at East Grand Forks is a rare surviving industrial structure associated with the regional growth of a Minnesota brewery. The large and impressive brick structure one of the most substantial such warehouses known to have been built in the state - is significant architecturally and as a reminder of the expansion of regional and national brands of beer after the turn-of-the-century. The growth of an extensive rail network in the latter decades of the nineteenth century and the introduction of refrigerated railroad cars allowed large brewers to ship beer to a large market. Agencies, commonly called beer depots and owned by the breweries, were opened in many towns. These ranged from small trackside icehouses to substantial office-warehouse combinations. The Hamm's Brewing Company of St. Paul opened an East Grand Forks cold-storage plant in 1890. This was soon outgrown, and they relocated to a larger frame In 1907 they enlarged their operations into the depot in 1897. brick building on the corner of DeMers and Fourth. In 1909 it was one of six beer depots lined up along DeMers Avenue. The \$24,000 building was the largest, the only brick structure, and the nicest. It remains the only substantially unaltered and recognizable of the warehouses today. The building housed offices and a storage capacity for twenty carloads of beer. Today it is the office and warehouse of a dairy products distributor.
