19. History <u>David Gist is believed to have built this house around c. 1786. Rezin Gist was a later owner. Land originally part of Nathaniel Gist tract, son of explorer Christopher Gist linked to house in Montgomery Co. "F. Matthews" 1877 Atlas Rezin is believed to have built a brick house in Montgomery Co. See MM-6.</u>			35. Organization <u>KHC</u>																											
20. Significance <u>Nathaniel Gist sold a tract of land near Stoner Creek to David Gist, who built this stone house in 1786. The imposing, symmetrical three-bay facade encloses a hall-parlor plan.
