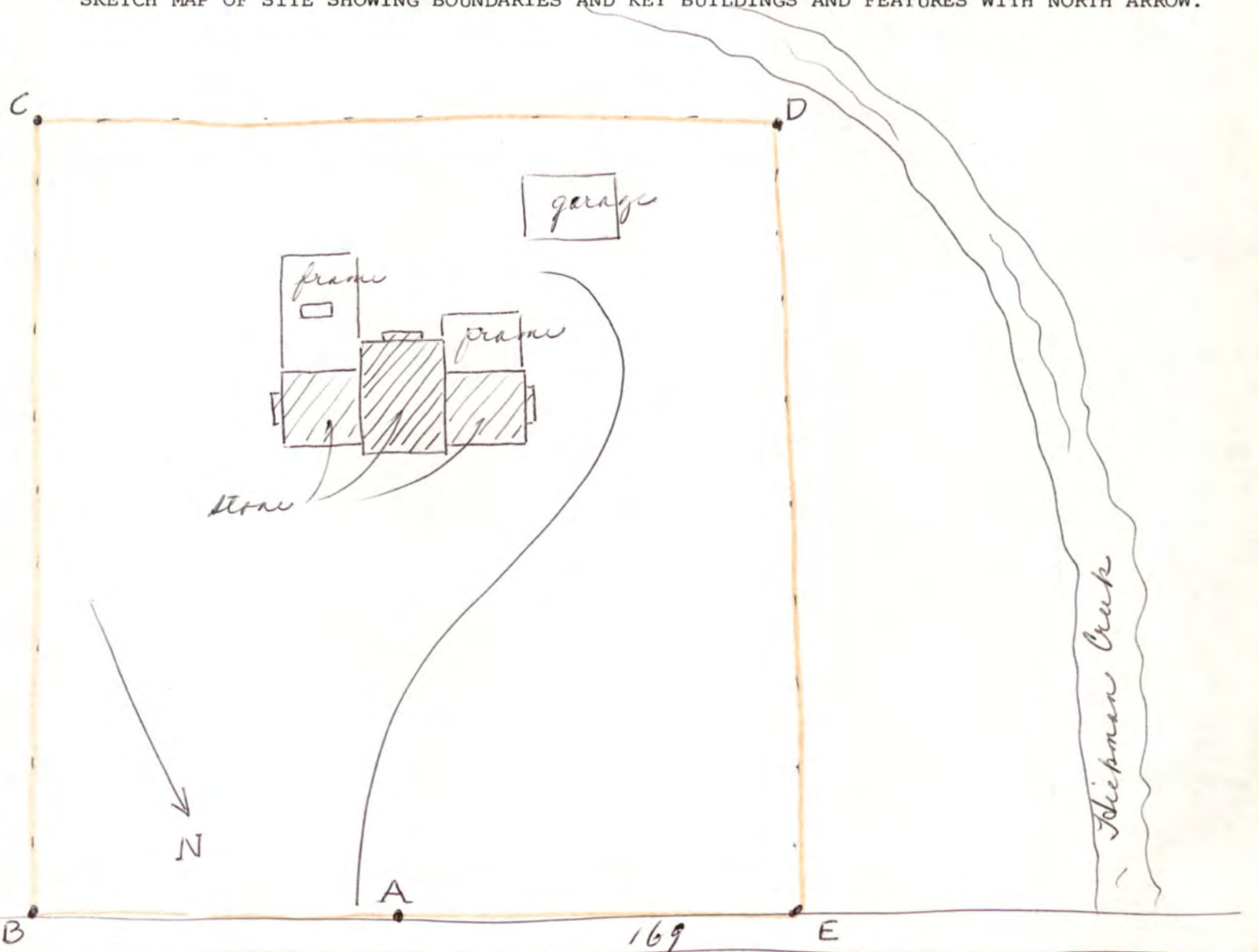



Dear Mr. Springate:

We have received your notarized letter of objection to the Stone Houses of Central Kentucky Thematic Nomination which includes your property located at 2329 Union Mill Pike in Nicholasville to the National Register of Historic Places. Your objection will be made known to the Kentucky Historic Preservation Review Board when it meets to consider proposed nominations.

The Review Board will be asked to evaluate the significance of your property for the National Register of Historic Places. If the Board and the State Historic Preservation Officer agree that the property meets National Register criteria, the nomination will be forwarded to Washington with your letter of objection where it will be evaluated for its eligibility for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.

Should the Keeper of the National Register determine that your property meets National Register criteria, it will be officially Determined Eligible for listing in the National Register according to 36 CFR 60. Properties Determined Eligible for National Register are not listed in the National Register and the owner receives none of the benefits of listing. On the other hand, Federal agencies are required in the planning of their projects to consider Determined Eligible properties as if they were actually listed.

If at some future date you or a future owner wish to have a Determined Eligible property listed in the National Register, you may submit a notarized letter requesting the change and it will be made.



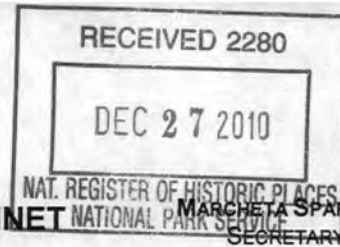
