Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

7. Description

The Harris B. Northcutt House, located in a very remote section of the state, is the largest and most prominent brick house in Grundy County. Situated near the center of Altamont, Tennessee, the Northcutt House dominates the streetscape of the small town.

The 2-story brick house, which is L shaped and laid in common bond, rests on a foundation of random sized native limestone. Built in 1885, the Northcutt house has a medium pitched gable roof with interlocking stamped metal shingles and a plain boxed cornice with return. Five single stack chimneys, one on each gable end, and three spaced evenly along the ell, accommodate ten fireplaces.

The five-bay facade (east elevation) is highlighted by a two-story pedimented portico with square plain columns and pilasters. The 4 over 4 windows on the main section have a segmental head with a radiating brick arch and stone lug sills. The windows on the facade are flanked by shaped louvered shutters. The windows on the ell are similar in shape, but are 6 over 6 in configuration. The main entrance has a semi-circular fanlight with a radiating brick arch over two double panelled wooden doors. A small vestibule to the front door was added ca. 1920. A segmentally arched door opening is located in the second story of the central bay behind the turned balustrade of the second story porch of the portico. This portico was added ca. 1920.

The gable ends of the main section are similar with a single window on each story located at the rear. The two-story gallery on the south elevation of the ell was originally open, but enclosed with weatherboards ca. 1920. During the 1940's and 50's, the owner rented out the rooms in the enclosed ell and the ramped entrance/fire escape was added.

The log outbuilding behind the Northcutt House predates the brick house by at least 40 years, and is very significant in the political history of Grundy County. This one story single pen structure served as the original Northcutt residence and later served as the Grundy County Courthouse in 1848. The half dovetail notched structure has a single exterior end stone chimney (present brick stack represents a later repair) and metal roof. A later log addition greatly enlarged the size of the cabin.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Harris Bradford Northcutt House was built in 1885. This large two story brick dwelling reflects the position and prominence the Northcutt family held in the county. The Northcutt House is significant because the Italianate influence on this basic Tennessee vernacular type house is unique in Grundy County. Located in a rather remote area of the state, the building's scale and size makes it an anomaly to the county. Coupled with the fact the Northcutts were very important in the political and economic development of the county, the Harris B. Northcutt House is perhaps the most important and unusual private residence within Grundy County.

Harris B. Northcutt came from a large and influential family. One of fifteen children, Northcutt was born on December 11, 1829, and grew up in Northcutt's Cove. His parents, General Adrian Northcutt and Sarah Cope, came from families who were prioneer settlers in Warren and Grundy counties. Harris B. Northcutt attended school at the Altamont Academy. At age 24, he began driving stock to southern markets having acquired several years' experience by working for his father, General Adrian Northcutt.

General Northcutt was a very important person in both the political and commercial development of Grundy County. In 1846 Adrian Northcutt raised a company of soldiers, was appointed captain and served in the Mexican War. He later advanced to the rank of Brigadier General in the Tennessee Militia. He served for 5 terms in the State Legislature, 6 years in the House (1845-49; 1855-57) and 4 years in the Senate (1849-51; 1853-55). Through General Northcutt's efforts, the town of Altamont was selected as the county seat. Northcutt established the first general merchandising store in Altamont.

In March 1858, Harris B. Northcutt took over his father's business, and continued its operation until his death in 1910. The firm, known as H. B. Northcutt and Sons, had a long and honored reputation in Grundy County. Because of the small size of Altamont (population 546) and the relative remote location atop the Cumberland Plateau, the Northcutt business became the focus of activities for the community, and the Northcutt family became one of the most powerful and influential in the county.

A large quantity of the firm's account books, day ledgers, and business receipts are incorporated into the Northcutt family papers at the Tennessee State Library and Archives. Of particular interest is a list showing the cost for construction of the house in 1885. Not only does the list provide exact cost of materials and names of the workmen who performed each task, but the list also gives one insight into the economics of that time period. Construction costs ranged from \$6 paid to Jim and Lade Fultz for digging the foundation, \$450 for 90,000 bricks, \$190 for laying of the bricks and \$35.54 for lime. Other costs included \$147 for windows and doors, \$80 for plastering, \$9 for guttering, \$9 for 3 kegs of nails, and \$100 for 25,000 shingles, for a total cost of \$1862.55.

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H. B. Northcutt married Fannie McGraw in 1862. Their sons, Thomas B. and James H, joined their father in the mercantile business, while their daughter Tinnie married James Moffit, a clerk in her father's store. After Northcutt's death in 1910, ownership of the house passed to Northcutt's daughter, Tinnie Moffit. Tinnie's daughter, Fanny Moffit, inherited the house after her mother's death ca. 1921, and lived there until her death in 1955. During Fanny's ownership, the Northcutt house also served as one of the few boarding houses in Altamont.

Fanny Moffit never married and died intestate. After a lengthy legal battle, ownership of the house passed to V. L. Northcutt and his sons, and today the Northcutt house stands as a constant reminder of an influential family in Grundy County.
