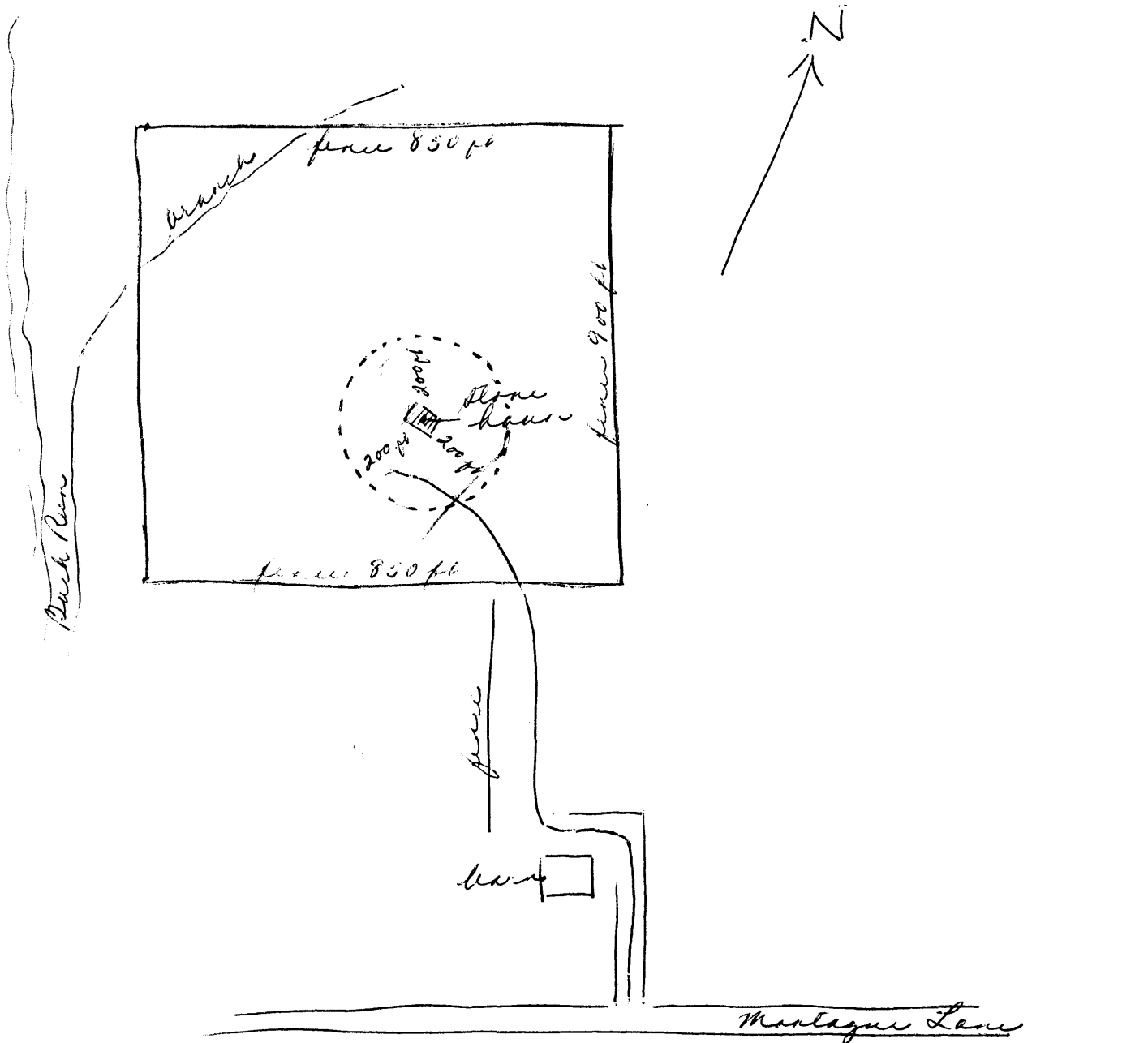

Beginning at A, the SW corner of the field near Duck Run, thence N 900 ft with fence to B, thence with fence 850 ft to C, thence with fence 900 ft to D, thence W 850 ft to the beginning, enclosing the stone house and surrounding field, the site having an expansion vista.
