ESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Located at 3 South Main Street in Berlin is Burley Manor, a Federal style house of the 1830's. Facing west the main section is three bays wide and two rooms deep with the door, surmounted by a fan light, in the south bay. Protecting the entrance is a porch supported by round columns with sunbursts decorating the square capitals. Between the capitals are arches with pointed teeth on the edges. There are wood benches on both sides of the porch. The two first story windows have twelve over twelve lights while the three in the second story have twelve over eight lights. Above each window is a recessed flat arch. All the windows have louvred shutters. There is a modillion cornice on the house and porch.

The north end has two windows, twelve over twelve sash, near the center of the first story and two twelve over eight light windows directly above. In the gable are two six over six sash windows. Rising through the peak of the gable is a large end chimney.

The south end has a window in the first and second stories of the west bay. Beneath these windows is a cellar entrance. Centered in the gable is a six over six light window. Extending from the eastern three bays is a one and-one-half-story dining room wing one bay wide and one room deep. Centered in the west facade is a single twelve over eight light window above which is a dormer in the gable roof. The modillion cornice matches that of the main house. The south end of this addition has twelve over eight light windows on the first story, one each in the center and west bays, and one six over six sash window in the gable to the right of the inside end chimney. This wing is also stuccoed and has recessed flat arches above the windows.

Perpendicular to the dining room wing is a one-and-one-half story kitchen wing. The west gable end has one six over six sash window in the first story with a second above it in the gable. The south side is three bays wide with the door in the center bay and six over six sash window in the other bays. A porch, covering this side, forms a catslide roof. The east end has a large inside end chimney.

Extending across the south end of the main section is the entrance hall and stair hall separated by a fluted eliptical arch with fluted key supported on fluted pilasters. The stairway, in the east end of the hall has two square balusters per tread and decorated step ends.

North of the hall is a large double parlor with sliding doors separating the two rooms. The firsplaces in the two rooms are identical. Each has a plain mantel shelf supported by curved brackets, with a concentric circle decoration in the square bracket ends, on top of doric colonettes. Pilasters, from floor to ceiling, frame the recessed twelve over twelve sash windows. The window and door frames are fluted and the corner blocks decorated with concentric circles. Above each of the two doors into the hall is a four light transom. South of the hall is the dining room. On the south wall is a projecting fireplace with a window on each side. The mantelpiece has reeded pilasters and end blocks and two recessed panels flanking a plain center tablet. The doorway from this room to the hall also is surmounted by a four light transom.

Next to the dining room along the east wall, is a hall to the kitchen. The kitchen has a large fireplace on the east end. To the right three

The land on which the town of Berlin, Maryland, stands was patented for William Tomkins in 1677 as a 300-acre tract called Burley. The town itself, however, did not appear until the early nineteenth century when it grew up around the tavern, blacksmith shop, and stable already standing. Although its name is now spelled like that of the German capital city, Berlin's residents still accent its first syllable in unconscious recognition of the town's beginnings.

Burley Manor was probably one of the earlier houses erected in Berlin. Built sometime between 1832 and 1837 by John Mitchell, it was sold to Mrs. Elizabeth Hammond, widow of Edward Hammond. She and her children moved into the house in 1837 and since then it has been lived in by three generations of their decendants.

John Taylor Hammond inherited Burley Manor from his mother Elizabeth in 1871. Educated at Jefferson Medical College in Philadelphia, he was a true country doctor who came and went at all hours of the day and night to care for his patients. His son, Thomas Victor Hammond, followed in his father's footsteps and became a doctor also. He practiced in Washington, D. C., only staying at Burley Manor during the summers until he retired there in 1920.

With Thomas Hammond's death in 1942, the Manor went to his son, Edward opkins Hammond. The latter's son and his young family are presently living at Burley.

Burley Manor itself is a house representative of small town living. A good example of second quarter nineteenth century houses in this part of Maryland, it also retains many of its original nineteenth century farm buildings.
