SIGNIFICANCE	 This house was first recorded on the W.P.A. survey and dated c.1780 by E. D. Keith; local tradition, however, dates the house much earlier than this. Land record research traces the house back to 1723 when Thomas Harrison received as his share of his father's estate, a "house frame and whatever was prepared for it." (Guilford Probate, v. 2, Estate of Thomas Harrison). Architecturally, the house, with its gambrel roof is unusual for Branford, where the two-story, center chimney Colonial predominated. The Thomas Harrison house is significant in Branford's collection of eighteenth-century houses for its integrity of location, design, setting, materials and workmanship. As an example of eighteenth-century architecture, it meets Criteria C of the National Register of Historic Places.
