Bridge No. 50-203-206 carries South Eighth Street over the Big Sioux River in Sioux Falls. A photograph taken in 1912 indicates that the present structure retains the triple-arch configuration of the original construction. Each span measures approximately 80 feet in length. At an undetermined date, the original detailing on the north elevation was obscured by a longitudinal, concrete "bulge" over the arches, which apparently carries utilities across the river. The south (upstream) elevation remains intact, displaying paired incised panels in the haunches of each arch; a protruding stringcourse marking the roadway level, and pilaster strips above each pier. The piers themselves are protected by pointed cutwaters with conical caps. The bridge's deck carries a paved, four-lane roadway flanked by sidewalks and concrete railings with neoclassically detailed balustrades . The railings mark the position of each pier with an elegant, fluted cast-iron light stand ornamented with consoles at the base. The concrete railing on the south side appears to be a reconstruction, although the light fixture may be original. A plaque at the southwest corner dates the restoration work at 1977. Since the remodeling was sensitive to the original design, the bridge retains very good integrity.

8. Significance

The Eighth Street Bridge is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places as part of the "Historic Bridges in South Dakota" Multiple Property Nomination. It is related to the historic context of "Historic Bridges in South Dakota, 1893-1943" and is classified with the associated property type for reinforced concrete highway bridges. This bridge is individually eligible for the National Register under Criterion C as an early example of a concrete deck arch. The bridge retains very good integrity.

By the early 1910s, reinforced concrete came into use in South Dakota for the construction of bridges. The earliest concrete bridges in South Dakota were built in the southeastern portion of the state, and many, if not all of these structures were professionally designed.

In July 1911, the Minnehaha County Board resolved to build a new "cement" bridge over the Big Sioux River at South Eighth Street in Sioux Falls, with the understanding that the city would reimburse the county within three years. The county's involvement was not particularly surprising. Sioux Falls was the county seat, and ever since the county board had built the first Eighth Street Bridge in 1876, the crossing had been the principal route into the city from the west side of the river. What was unusual was that the County Commissioners specified a concrete bridge -- the first in both Sioux Falls and Minnehaha County, and among the first in the entire state. Only one bidder responded, N. M. Stark and Company of Des Moines, and its offer of \$45,000 was accepted. Stark and Company completed the structure by April 1912.

Built prior to 1920, the Eighth Street Bridge represents the earliest, prestandardization, experimental era in reinforced-concrete bridge construction.
