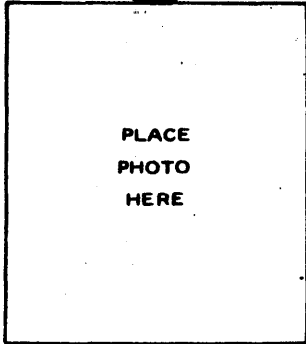

Deed research and early maps indicate that the Wells Family were early owners. As of this date can only verify Alexander Wells to the 1854 date.* In comparison with other homes in this area, this house requires styling similar to homes built in late 1700's.

Architecturally

- Four fireplaces on central chimney
- Moldings more ornate as well as stair banister
- Wainscotting Gunstock corner posts etc.
