

Intermediate boundary marker Northwest #6 is located in a small field approximately 150 feet northeast of the intersection between Park and Western Avenues. The sandstone marker is in poor condition. A 3' x 3' x 5'2" iron fence, in good condition, surrounds the marker.

Northwest #6 boundary stone was the third marker to be located in Maryland. It was laid in 1792. It is situated in a small field which runs along Western Avenue. Its fence was dedicated in June 1917 by the Independence Bell Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Verbal Boundary Description:

The stone is located approximately 60 feet northwest of the centerline of Western Avenue (District of Columbia) and 150 feet northeast of the centerline of Park Avenue (Maryland). The fence surrounds the stone.

Boundary Justification:

The boundary stone and fence have historically been situated at this location and maintain historic integrity.
