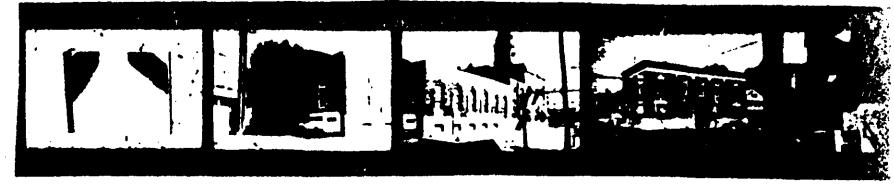
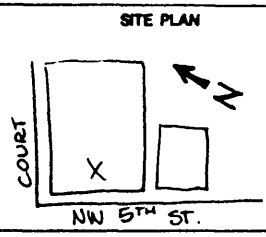

E. This property is significant for two reasons. First is its association with the Eagles, a prominent local benevolent institution. Second is the building's architectural merit. Built in 1912, the edifice was designed by local architect Harry E. Boyle. Boyle became one of the successors to Shopbell & Company, developing a regional practice with a specialty for large public buildings.
