

Description The Confederate Monument on the courthouse lawn in Lawrenceburg consists of a carved granite statute of a Confederate soldier atop an inscribed granite pedestal. The statute is approximately eight feet tall. The figure is dressed in a winter coat and the soldier is wearing a broad brimmed hat and is resting upon his rifle. The figure of a soldier is atop a pedestal that is approximately 8 feet tall. On four faces of the pedestal are listed the names of the Confederate regiments raised in Anderson County and a list of the men who were wounded or killed during the Civil War.

Statement of Significance The Confederate Monument in Lawrenceburg meets National Register Criterion A and is significant under the context of "Civil War Monuments in Kentucky, 1861-1935." The monument was created by former Confederate soldiers in Anderson County in wanted to honor the memory of their comrades who fought for the "Lost Cause." The monument was unveiled in 1894. It is significant because it is a Civil War monument in Kentucky that was built before 1935 has not been severely altered and has not been moved. See registration requirements, pp. F-2 and pp. F-3 of Multiple Property Documentation Form.

Verbal Boundary Description - The Confederate Monument in Lawrenceburg boundaries form a circle with a radius of ten feet centered on the monument located on the southwest corner of the courthouse lawn.

Verbal Boundary Justification - The area associated with the monument is restricted to the ground on which the monument sits and a small buffer around it. The setting outside such a restricted area is not seen as critically important to maintaining an integrity of association. Because the focus of the multiple property submissions is the significance of the monuments, their proposed area of listing will reflect that they have been considered by-and-large, in isolation from their surrounds.


