18. Description

This 2 1/2-story frame farmhouse, originally an early 19th-century "Cape" cottage, has been added to in an unusual and eccentric manner over the years, presenting an angular and picturesque roofline of clipped gables, variety of shed and peaked dormers, peaked gable above front doorway, and 2 tiers of porches on the southwest corner. Very random small-paned fenestration. Evokes feeling of rambling English country cottage. A one-stall garage has recently been installed in the 1-1/2 story wing on the north. The house is set on a hillside, at the end of a small lane, with open slopes to the south.

20. Significance

Early 19th-century farmhouse delightfully, whimsically and very individually added to over its history. Later associated with era (1890-1930) of "gentleman's farms" of Dublin summer colony, and as residence of noted Russian Scholar Ernest J. Simmons (1903-1972).

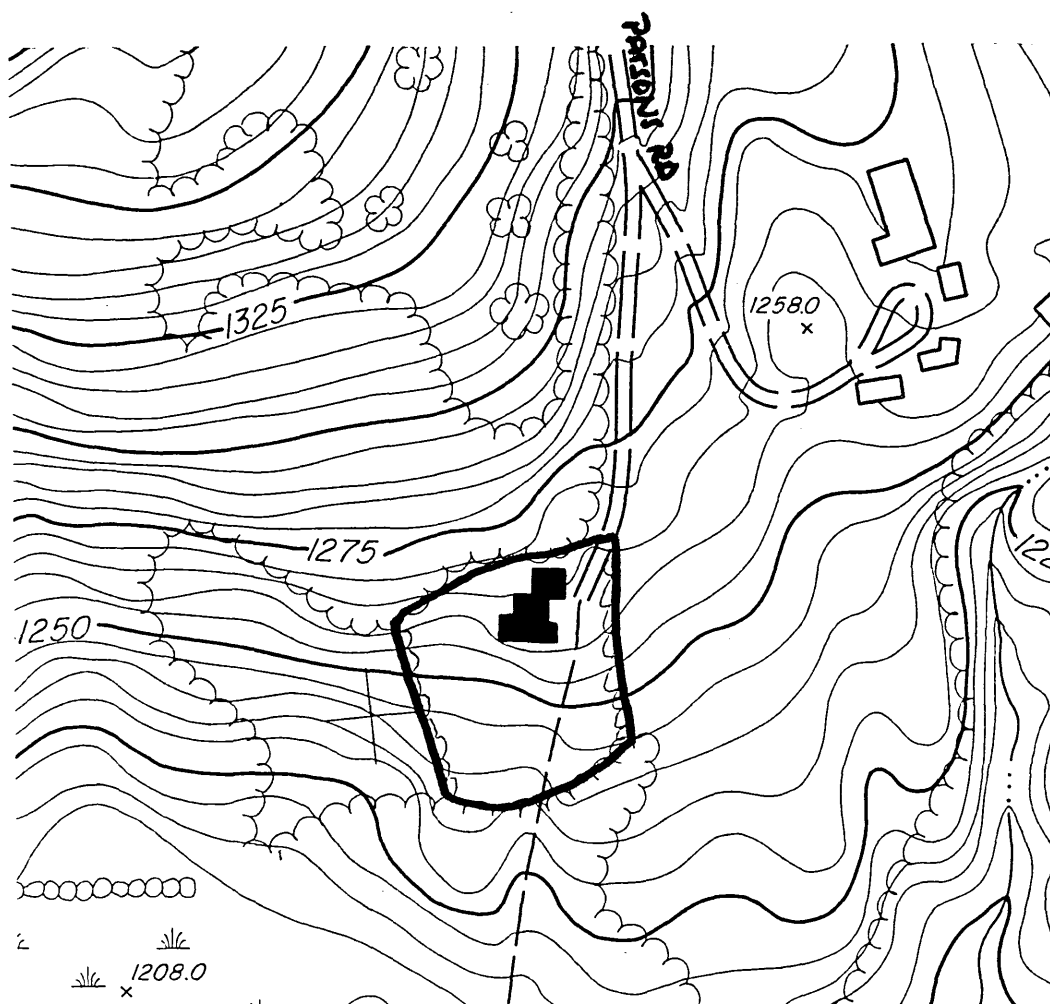

19. History

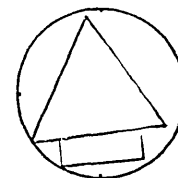
Built about 1816 by Moses Corey (1787--1866) and his wife Lydia, who that year purchased 100 acres here from her father Abner Hinds (1750-1834). Corey, who was selectman 1824, 1834-35 and school agent sold the farm in 1850. In 1889, after passing through several owners, it became part of a large complex of "gentleman's farms" owned by Mrs. William Parsons of Boston and her family. Summer residence of her daughter Miss Georgianna Parsons (c.1895-1903) a wealthy and eccentric amateur artist, who extensively remodeled it. It was known as "Maplecote" or "Lower Farm" and after her death (in 1903) remained in the family until purchased c.1930 by Nicholas & Rebecca Malasheff (artist-dancer daughter of Egyptologist Joseph Lindon Smith). Subsequently residence of Columbia University professor Ernest J. Simmons (chairman Dept. of Slavic Languages), authority on Russian literature, biographer of Tolstoy, Chekov, Pushkin, et.al. Presently owned by his daughter-in-law.

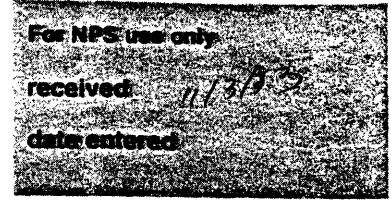
