STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:	PHOTOS		
The Newsom-Smith House was constructed by Isaac Newsom, who came to Lawrence County circa 1830 with John Newsom. The Newsoms were originally from North Carolina, and arrived at Lawrence County via Georgia and Marion County. The Newsoms settled this area east of the Pearl in the northeastern section of the county, and built similar if not identical houses on their neighboring plantations. The house has been owned continuously by the Smith family since the post-Civil War period, circa 1865. Its historical significance is attributed to its association with the Newsom family, important early settler of Lawrence County, and to its extended ownership by the Smith family for over 100 years.
