

The owner believes the house was built by a Conrad Pulis, but no connection has been found. This was part of Lot #29 of the Ramapough Tract, bought on January 26, 1787 by John Rattan, Jr. (173.16 acres). The house seems to be the only early house within the tract, so it may have been built by him c. 1790. - CKT.
