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44. Description and House Plan:

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44. One and one-half story, three bay, dry-stone hall-parlor house, 24 X 35. Exterior chimneys each end flanked by square upstairs windows. Upper Ordovician limestone, grey color, squared and laid in regular courses; voussoirs above openings. Original mortar steeple pointed. Windows have wide frames with mitered corners; (butted frames upstairs) 9/9 sash. Transom above center door. Door in north end also.

Interior has chairrail, late Federal molding, beaded batten doors. Two original mantels--one breakfront, plain; one breakfront, gauged and fluted; (photo \mathcal{I}); no fireplaces up. Enclosed corner stair arises from east rear along partition wall, space taken from parlor. Second, third and fourth steps are diamond-shaped to wind from both rooms (photos \mathcal{I} , \mathcal{I}).

Late 19th century frame ell on rear.

Site has rock fence in front of house, stone root cellar, frame shed, and old barn.
