Main house is 5 bay 2 story  
central hall Flemish bond brick with  
2 story offset ell on SE corner and frame  
addition beyond. One interior, 1 exterior  
chimney; stone foundation. Pugged frames,  
ovolo trim, square hills, flat arches;  
horizontal diamond bars on cellar windows  
w mullions; covered cellar entrance. Blind  
Palladian window above later entrance,  
extends into small eave pediment. Two story  
porch across rear and N side of ell (upper  
story now enclosed). House painted white;  
3 bay 1 story flat roofed bracketed front  
porch added. Interior not seen, but said  
to contain reded woodwork, mantles and  
chair rail, ash floors. Hollowed logs in  
cellar installed before 1st floor built. - 18.18

Log smoke house rear of house. Half  
doar tailed notching with joints so tight  
chinking not needed between logs. Gutter  
door, strap hinges.

Long tree lined driveway to house.  
Brick walk from front door to stone  
mounting block at driveway.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A at the NW corner of the yard, thence 225 ft E to B at a fence, thence with fence 280 ft S to C, thence leaving fence 225 ft<sup>W</sup> parallel to A-B to D, thence N 280 ft, joining fence around yard & with fence to the beginning, containing the brick house, log smoke house and stone quarters - about 1 1/2 acre.
