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## 7. Description

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**Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance**

Situated on a shaded residential block, the William Havens House (Pearson residence) is a two-story, T-plan brick dwelling with two, one-story wings (one is brick and the other is frame that is now covered with aluminum siding) located to the rear. Bricks used to construct the house were fired in a nearby kiln. The foundation is fieldstone and mortar. A front porch with pent roof is supported by simple Doric columns. Fenestration includes arched rectangular windows. A frame cornice is located beneath the roofline and is devoid of ornamentation. From the ground level, the roof appears to be flat but it is not. A trough surrounds the outer edges of the roof so that rain and melted snow can run to a single drain that was once attached to a cistern. There is also a small brick chimney projecting from the roof towards the north (side) facade of the house.

The only change made to the basic layout of the interior is the addition of a bathroom which is located in the frame wing, and the modernization of the kitchen which is located in the brick wing. Many of the original interior features have been retained including the moldings, bullseye corner block over the doors, the windows surrounds and the wainscoting.

**Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)**

The William T. Havens House (now the Pearson residence) is significant in the area of architecture and for its associations with one of the first residents of Webster, William T. Havens who contributed to the early development of the town.

William T. Havens homesteaded to the area in 1885 and served as the first postmaster in Webster.<sup>1</sup> In 1889, he built a large brick house at 915 E. 1st Street which was considered to be at the time one of the largest and most elegant homes in the town.<sup>2</sup> A one-story frame wing with shed roof was added around 1905.<sup>3</sup>

Although some of the commercial buildings in Webster utilized the same brick, Mr. Haven's house has the distinction of being the only residential structure to have been constructed from bricks fired at a kiln located north of town (the kiln existed for only a short period of time). Another feature of the house is the distinctive roof drainage system. A trough surrounds the outer edges of the roof so that rain and melted snow can run to a single drain that was attached to a cistern. The house today still retains many of its original exterior features including its brick facade and fenestration, and interior features such as moldings, bullseye corner blocks over the doors, window surrounds and wainscoting.




