off the doors with iron flower pot holders. The second and third floors have full balconies with the same railing and iron braces supporting the balconies. The section is capped a stepped brick parapet with a stone coping and stylized geometric stone decorations. Between these end facades is an iron fence with four incised stone piers. Two of the pieces are capped by orbs and two with circular glass globes. The walls of the side facades facing the court contain three bays each which extend for the full height of the building. The front plane of the bay continues the three French door treatments with balconies. The chamfered walls have double-hung windows. The bays are capped by a small gabled roof supported by arched wood braces, with a bulls' eye window under each roof eave.

The wall between the first and second projecting bays contain an entry with a stone surround. The two floors above the entry each contain two stainedglass windows place in a stepped arrangement. The rear wall of the building which is parllel to the front fence consists of two bays articulated by a chimney. Each floor has a continous balcony with an iron rail and flower pot holders and two pairs of French doors per bay.
