DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This mid 19th century cemetary gatehouse reflects a combination of Romanesque and Italiante architectural styles. It is Romanesque in its massiveness and use of round stone arches. It is Italianate in its low pitched hip roof with a broad overhanging cornice with wood brackets and its Paladian window. This symetrical fieldstone structure is 2 stories with a larger center mass 25 feet wide and 33 feet deep. It is flanked on both sides by smaller masses, the total measuring 56 feet across and 33 feet deep.

This cemetary structure was designed to function as an entrance gatehouse, cemetary office, chapel, and caretakers residence. The entrance roadway passes through a large open stone arch in the central section of the building. There is a smaller archway on each side of the large arch for pedestrian walkways. Above on the second floor, which is part of the caretaker's quarters, is a triple arched modified Palladian window. This comprises the center section.

There is a 2 story lower stone wing on each side of the center archway. On the front facades, each wing has a single arched window extending through both the first and second floors. One side is the chapel which originally had a 20 foot high ceiling, now lowered with a false ceiling. The other side is 2 stories with 2 office rooms on the first floor and 2 rooms on the second floor comprising the other section of the caretaker's quarters. More recently a one story wood frame kitchen wing was added to this side.

Though the building is in need of repairs it is very much intact both on the exterior and interior. The removal of the cupola is the major exterior alteration. The interior has many of its original features including shutters, doors, pews, chapel furniture, etc.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Q.

This cemetary gatehouse was built in <u>1858</u>. It is an expression of mid 19th century romanticism which greatly affected the attitudes, lifestyle, literature, architecture, etc. of the people of that period. The cemetary gatehouse was one of these expressions, reflecting a social attitude towards death. These buildings were represented in numerous Victorian architectural styles. More common were the Gothic and Egyptian styles. This cemetary structure combined

The gatehouse at the Colestown Cemetary is one of the last links to the earlier cultural history of a small group communities that do not exist today. The gatehouse was built at the entrance to the cemetary which has its roots in the eighteenth century. Colestown at that time, included the Fountain Hotel Resort and Roberts' Mill among its buildings. Today, all that remains is the Gatehouse, surrounded by a modern community.

Colestown was in the midst of a predominatly agricultural environment. The chapel and the cemetary fulfilled the social needs of the community at the time of individual tradgedy. The chapel was non-sectarian so that all could use it. The company was organized by local citizens who were aware that the farming community lacked facilities and the organization at the time of death. The Cemetary Company, and by extention, the gatehouse and chapel, served an important social function in this nineteenth century society.

The Cemetary Company itself, was organized in 1858, by a group of prominent men in the community. Their first goal was the construction of a chapel. Contracts were awarded for the building of the chapel, receiving Nault and Sexton's residence to Charles Wilson of Camden. The cost of the entire construction was \$4385.57. The founders of the company were actively involved in all phases of construction, from fund raising to physical work on the site.
