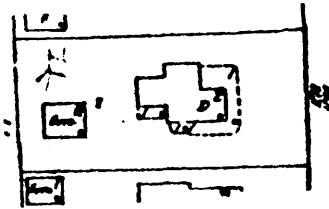

DESCRIPTION

FORM 2-story, cross-gable, 1-story projecting bay on south CONST. DATE c. 1873  
MATERIALS Wood frame ARCH STYLE Gothic Revival  
FENESTRATION Rectangular or with cut corners, in narrow molded surrounds  
DIST. FEATURES \_\_\_\_\_  
ALTERATIONS Porch c. 1890-1900  
SITE & RELATED STR. Set well back on terraced lot

STATEMENT

This house is among the few Gothic Revival residences remaining in Davenport. The distinctive feature is the steeply-pitched cross-gable roof, which at the front is repeated in a small wall dormer. Diamond-shaped openings in the gable end and dormer, and even the chamfered corners of the windows contribute to the feeling of verticality so important to the style. The later, Colonial Revival porch, however, lessens the impact due to its pronounced horizontality.

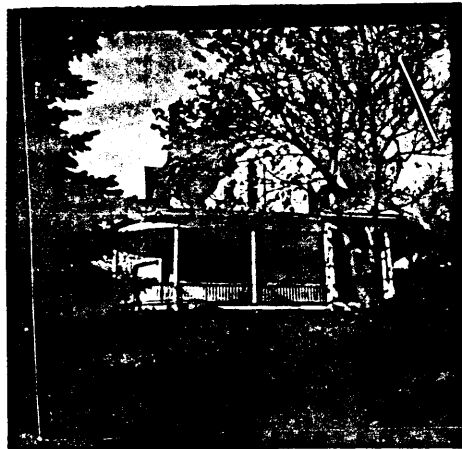
