DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Jackson Avenue Warehouse District is comprised of buildings one block west of Central Street on the north side of the avenue and part of a block on the same side east of Central. To the west and following the slight curve of the street is a row of three and a few four-story warehouses built of brick. These structures date from the late nineteenth-early twentieth century. A few have only plain flat facades; others have iron fronts; and most display decorative details in stone or brick or terra cotta or a combination of these materials. The first floors of a limited number of the buildings have been altered. The majority appear to be in original condition.

On the northeast corner of Central Street and Jackson Avenue is a brick turreted building. From the exterior it appears to be a two and a half story structure with an iron front on the street floor. The building is decorated with brickwork contrasted with rough stone details, and variously shaped windows.

The south side of Jackson Avenue contains buildings of a later date and of little architectural note. The area could be described as a deteriorating commercial district.

Collectively the buildings present the most distinguished and interesting group of structures in the city. Little specific information about the area could be obtained. The use of the buildings as warehouses and offices has not changed since their construction. One exception is the turreted buildings on the northeast corner of the Central and Jackson intersection.
