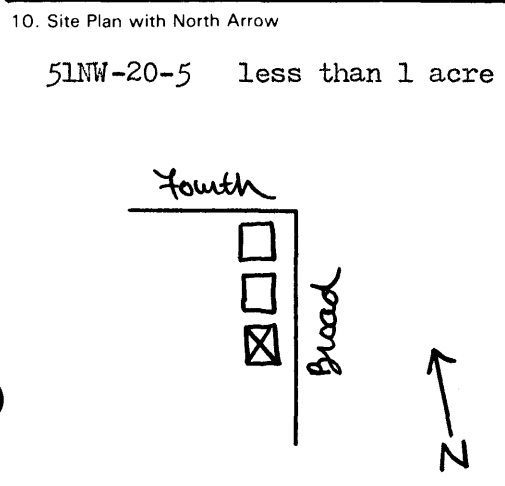

Beaded clapboard on front of house only. Windows are 1/1 double hung. Roof is gable at front, with centrally located brick chimney. Roof at rear is flat, over shed addition.
