STANDING STRUCTURES SURVEY

There are about seventy-five 50+ year old commercial buildings in Lafayette Parish, most of which date from the 1920's. Of these seventy-five, the Ducrest Building is one of only four known examples which reflect the commercial Italianate taste. This can be seen in the pressed tin siding which imitates stonework and in the elaborate, ornamental modillion cornice. Virtually all other old commercial buildings in the parish reflect

later styles.

The above building was constructed in 1903 by T. Lucien Ducrest, who operated a pharmacy there for over thirty-five years. Upon Mr. Ducrest's death, the building was purchased by his son, Francis M. Ducrest, who maintained the building and ran the store for thirty-one years. After the death of Francis M. Ducrest, his wife leased the building to George DeBaillon, the present occupant.
