no tool marks, original pointing
fled (being redone w staple pointing);
interior end chimney; top plate visible (photo 3)
on end; 1 small attic window, N end only;
no cellar.

Interior has winding stair in SW corner;
some batten, some panel, doors; wrought iron
hinges, some strap, some HL; had board
partition walls. Large fire place in hall
has adged oak lintel.

Roof extended on S gable end. Window
frames and sash changed - have narrow
interior corner frames. Front doorway has
narrow beaded frame, not pegged, ogive trim
(early 19th C.) frame

One story ell on W side stone house
(ca. 1825) has elaborate Federal woodwork
of Matthew Lowry type: rosette corner blocks, (photo 4)
fluted pilasters - inside and out; chair rail;
sunburst mantle w beading & rope carving.

On N end of house is a pegged, beech frame
of a single room w exterior stone chimney; no (photo 1)
doorway into stone house.

House had a 1 story shed roof porch w chamfered
posts across E side (now removed). New frame
addition built on W side beside early wing.

In N E corner of yard is a post cellar with
frame grainary above. (dairy)

House possibly originally faced the river (having
rear porch), but is now oriented toward the E. It
is built on nearly level land w gentle slope to river
on the W and branch on the N.

Section. Was co-founder of New Providence
Presbyterian Church, where he was buried in 1810.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A at a fence corner in the NE corner of the yard, thence S w fence 150 ft to B, thence at right angle to fence 150 ft W to C, thence parallel to A-B 150 ft N to D, thence with the fence E 180 ft to the beginning, containing the stone house and dairy - about 2/3 acre.
