3. wreckage of plane is seen, just behind Eskima. Two monuments are on higher ground, some 100' to right of this; but facing the lagoon.

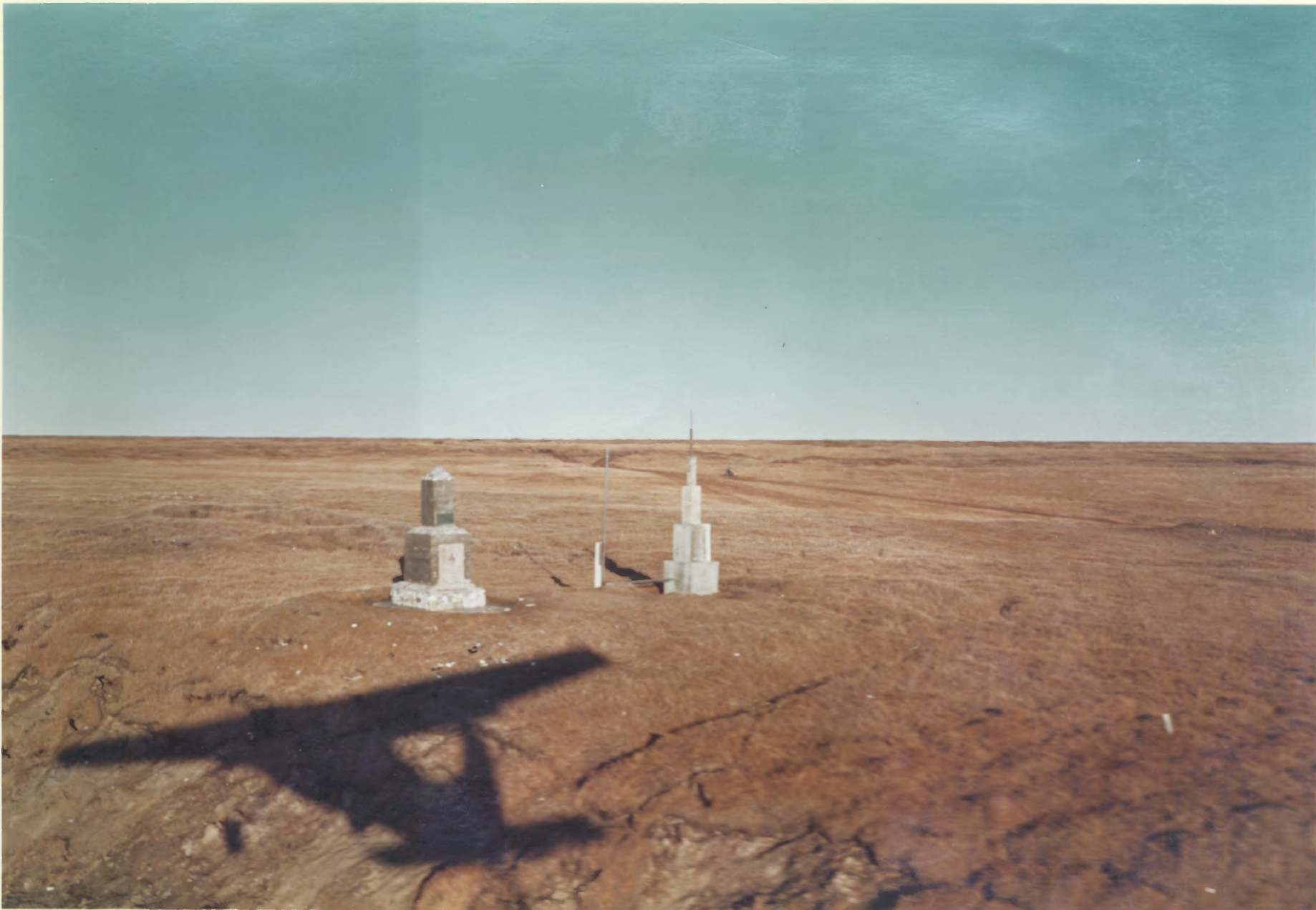
