### 7. Description

The La Puerta Lodge consists of three one-story buildings with flat roofs, white stucco walls, and concrete foundations. The eight-unit motel portion has a linear plan and is perpendicular to the street along the west side of the property. A former owner's residence is located at the southeast corner, and a discreet office and manager's residence is located in the central portion of the property and faces on Central Avenue. All three buildings have parapets and individual details reflecting the Southwest Vernacular Style. These stylistic details together with the spatial arrangement of the buildings and the motel's striking neon sign give the lodge a strong feeling of a familyrun 1940s tourist court.

The eight-unit motel has a continuous portal with wood post supports and small corbels framing garages interspersed between the court's living units. The portal beam, the solid wood doors with small diamond lights at each of the units' entries, and the wood surrounds of the front unit facing northeast onto Central Avenue have ornately-carved floral designs. The former residence has exposed vigas and stucco hoods with viga-like supports at its front windows and door. The office/residence has a cut-out porch with a portal in the middle of the building. The motel office extends forward at the west end with three concrete steps leading to its entry, a multi-light wood frame door, and a red neon office sign to the left of the door. All of the buildings have metal casement windows.

A low-walled patio with trees and landscaping is located between the office and the motel building. Two curb cuts permit access to the property, with parking spaces in front of the office as well as in the garages. Perpendicular to the street at the sidewalk is the motel's sign. Framed by two large masonry piers, the sign consists of the motel's name outlined in neon. Additional neon lines the portal of the motel and the parapet of the office. the most flamboyant moving portions of the neon have been<sup>‡</sup> removed to conform to city sign ordinances. Changes to the property are small and include the addition of a greenhouse to the rear corner of the office/residence and the in-fill of one of the garage units.

## 8. Statement of Significance

The La Puerta Lodge is one of the best examples of a largely unaltered tourist court remaining along Route 66 in New Mexico. Ralph Smith who operated the court through 1954, built the motel and residence portions in 1949 and the current office/residence in 1952. The family of the present owner, Pauline Bauer, acquired the property in 1954. One of the easternmost motels along the East Central Avenue commercial strip in the late 1940s and early 1950s, the La Puerta Lodge with its moving neon sign became a favorite stopping place for many motorists travelling Route 66. Because of this close association with the golden era of tourism along Route 66, the property is eligible under Criterion A. The property also qualifies under Criterion C for the way in which its setting, location, design and materials reflect early tourist court construction in New Mexico. In particular, the garages framed by the elaborately carved wood portal, the spatial arrangement of the motel, office/residential and patio elements, and the continued use of early signage convey the historic significance of the property. Criterion Consideration G also applies to the property in that it is of exceptional importance within its property type. It reflects the continuation of the same building patterns for tourist courts, discussed in the Multiple Property listing, that appeared prior to World War II and continued through the period of significance.
