NAME Stibral Homestead and Farmstead

DESCRIPTION The Stibral Homestead and Farmstead historic buildings consist of the original house, a bowed barn, and two other out-buildings. The simple 1 1/2 story homestead house has a corrugated metal gable roof and a rectangular plan. Constructed in 1880, this log and clapboard structure has one small window in each gable end and two single door entries, one on the north, and one on the south facade. The bowed roof barn was constructed in the early 1930's, as were the other out-buildings on the property. There is a modern house on the property which is not part of the site.

SIGNIFICANCE The significance of the Stibral Homestead and Farmstead is in two areas: architecture and settlement. Of these, architecture is the more important because this 1880 house's facing material is log, few of which remain in Yankton County. Also important is the fact that this building relates to the early years of settlement in Yankton County. Valclav Stibral, a Czechoslovakian immigrant, received the U.S. patent for this land in 1880. Valclav held the land until 1917, at which time he sold it to his son Charles Stibral, who held it until the 1950's. Charles then sold it to other members of the family. Because this property has been in the hands of the Stibral family since 1880, it serves as an important connection between past settlement and present life style.

BOUNDARIES The nominated property is located 1600 feet west of the road running into Lesterville and 4400 feet northwest of the intersection of the north-south road into Lesterville and the east-west road into Tabor.
