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Architectural Description and Significance:  
 This two story Flagg System house faces west and is 40 x 47 feet. It has limestone exterior walls and a composition gable roof. There are three shed dormers and two chimneys with distinctive round openings. A one story section links house and garage. This original garage has an unusual arched stone doorway. This section once contained the laundry room which has been converted to a den. There is a beam and girder ceiling throughout the downstairs except in the kitchen where it has been lowered. Casement windows open inward over tile sills. There is a walk-in attic and half basement.
