The # 6 Brushy Voting House is situated on a large flat lot at the corner of State Highway 32 and Spruce Street, ½ mile north of Route 785. The voting house was named for its location. The lot was donated to the county by David and Lacy Epperhart. Son-inlaw, Bill Stewart, states the transfer was made with a hand shake and there was never any written confirmation of the transfer. In later years, the widower, David Epperhart, lived in the building and would vacate the property when the building was needed for voting (Bill Stewart Interview).

The # 6 Brushy Voting House is constructed of ashlar cut stone and beaded mortar. The stone was quarried from a hill side on Big Brushy Road (Bill Stewart Interview). Exposed beams project from the original standing seam tin roof. One over one windows are placed on the east and west elevations, with three 2' x 2' 2/2 lights located under the north gable eave. The windows have ashlar cut stone sills, but lack lintels. The three lights on the north elevation were positioned high to give light and to ensure privacy to citizens voting in three booths located under the windows. Victorian beaded boards seal the gable ends between the stone walls and roof. The original door with three vertical lights is intact. A capped yellow brick chimney is located at the center of the roof ridge. NSP Form 10-900-a
