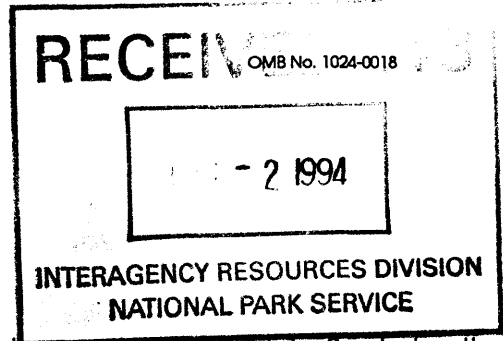

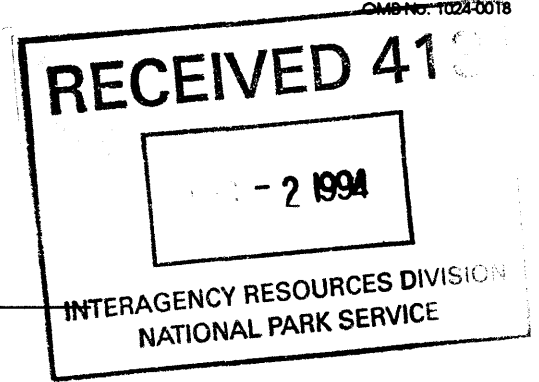

Description

The H. M. Coe House was constructed in 1895. The builder is unknown. The building is constructed in the Colonial Revival architectural style with Queen Anne influences and represents the Builder's Plan Book property type. The house retains substantial integrity of design, materials, and workmanship. The H. M. Coe has been in continuous use as a single family dwelling from 1895 to the present day.

The H. M. Coe House is located on Lot 34 of La Villa Place in the Bennett Addition. La Villa Place was originally subdivided in 1890. The building faces west onto North 4th Avenue. The streetscape along North 4th Avenue is characterized by modest, working class residences of historic and contemporary construction. No outbuildings are located on the site.

The H. M. Coe House is a L-shaped, one-story building of brick construction. The building measures 25 x 35 feet. The hipped roof is intersected by a front gable roof over an off-set ell and features a hipped dormer. The roof is covered with standing seam metal. It has a stone foundation.

Exterior features include a recessed entry veranda with a sloped roof supported by turned wood posts. The windows are double hung with three over one and one over one wood sash. Window openings have segmental arches. The lowered shutters have been added. An off-center entry with a late four panel door is located at the side wall of the ell. Important architectural elements include boxed eaves, scalloped and diamond shaped wood shingles at the gable head, and a semi-circular, multi-lite gable window.

Alterations are limited to a historic period rear addition.

Statement of Significance

The H. M. Coe House is significant under Criteria C under the area of significance of Architecture. It is representative of the historic context "Residential Architecture in Phoenix Prior to 1901." Built in 1895 and constructed in the Colonial Revival architectural style with Queen Anne influences, the H. M. Coe House is representative of the Builder's Plan Book property type. The H. M. Coe House is also important in the area of Community Planning. As one of only three nineteenth century buildings remaining in the La Villa Place subdivision of the Bennett Addition, which was originally subdivided in 1890, the H. M. Coe House represents a rare example of its period and the historic context "Nineteenth Century Community Development in Phoenix."

A popular architectural style used during the plan book era was the Colonial Revival style. The use of the style in residential architecture was wide spread in the late nineteenth century. Vernacular adaptations of plan book examples of the style, as demonstrated by the H.M. Coe House, were once common. The house illustrates a local interpretation of the plan book designs that resulted in a simply detailed building which incorporates the major stylistic concepts of Colonial architecture. With the exception of a modest rear addition and the installation of wood shutters, the Colonial Revival inspired design of the H.M. Coe

Statement of Significance (Continued)

House remains intact. Stylistic features include a typical square plan with off-set ell variation covered by a hipped and intersecting gable roof. Other common architectural traits that illustrate the Colonial Revival style, influenced to a degree by the Victorian era, include the recessed entry veranda with shed roof and turned wood columns, a half-round gable window, shingled gable head, and molding and trim in classical shapes.
