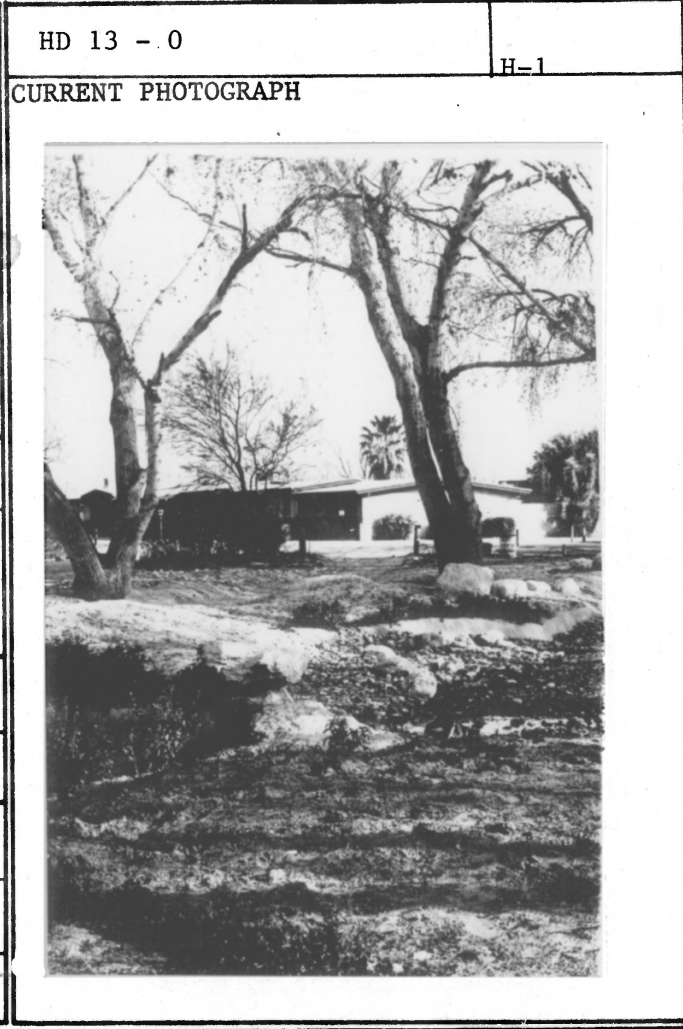

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Property is the site of Arizona BB:9:14, a Hohokam Indian Village dating from 300 to 1400 A.D. Excavation of the site sponsored by Pima County Parks and Recreation Dept. and the Arizona State Museum. Planning and funding being sought for a permanent display of artifacts and descriptive exhibits. Pima County is currently constructing a display of water ecosystems in the desert in the adjacent cottonwood grove.
