Significance (cont.)

between the two log pens of the dogtrot form house sometime after the initial stage of construction. Both pens are V-notched, but differences in the size of the timbers suggest that they were built at slightly different times. One of the pens is deeper than the other, creating an unusual effect at the chimney end of an off-center chimney.
