Prior to 1870, Jewish dead were buried in Natchez. The site is significant as a reflection of the Jewish community in Port Gibson, and for its historic value as one of the early Jewish cemeteries in the state after those in Natchez, Grand Gulf, Columbus, Vicksburg, and Jackson (James J. Pillar, "Religious and Cultural Life, 1817-1860," in A History of Mississippi, 2 vols., ed. Richard A. McLemore (Hattiesburg: University Press, 1973), 1:392-93.
